

Position: Senior Geologist

Location: Vancouver, BC. The role requires significant business travel > 50% per month, dependent on active work programs at the Spanish Mountain Gold (SMG) project. The ideal candidate must be ready for last minute, short-term travel. This is not a Vancouver office-based role.

Job Category: 3-month contract position, with potential for full time consideration

Job Description: As the Company builds a dynamic team of geoscientists and staff for the (SMG) project in Central British Columbia near Williams Lake, and reporting to the Director of Exploration, the Sr. Geologist will provide strong leadership to the technical group.

Key Responsibilities:

- Supervise and mentor staff in the application of industry leading best practices in areas of geoscience systems and protocols, health and safety, and environmental stewardship;
- Assist in supervising and managing drilling contractors;
- Provide leadership and management to exploration activities from prospecting to establishment of mineral resources through oversight of all staff and stakeholders, while ensuring the implementation of efficient and effective data acquisition processes for the project;
- Foster the collection of, compilation of, data management of, and interpretation of all geoscience information acquired from exploration programs including but not limited to diamond drilling, geological mapping, both ground-based and airborne geophysics, and surficial geochemical sampling;
- Develop regional scale, target scale, and deposit scale geological models (lithology, structure, alteration, and mineralization) in the Company's software platforms;
- Through target generation initiatives, contribute to the development of an exploration pipeline of targets and to strategic exploration planning for both short-term and long-term periods;
- Responsible for the detailed interpretation, analysis, and continuous improvement in understanding of the controls of mineralizing systems in the project area;
- Foster the collection of, compilation of, data management of, and interpretation of all geoscience information acquired from exploration programs including but not limited to diamond drilling, geological mapping, both ground-based and airborne geophysics, and surficial geochemical sampling;
- Provide daily, weekly and monthly reporting to the Director of Exploration, as well as develop strong reporting mechanisms for the exploration team, including oversight over production of materials as requested for corporate disclosure and marketing;
- Participate in the geological logging of diamond drill core, including the identification and description of lithology, alteration, mineralization, and structure, as directed by the Company;
- With the Director of Exploration, participate in the establishment and implementation of professional development training programs that will provide learning opportunities for knowledge growth within the exploration team;
- Any other duties assigned by the Director Exploration or senior management.

Qualifications and Skills Requirements:

- B.Sc. in Geology or related discipline, with a Professional Geoscientist designation. A **post-graduate degree will be deemed a major asset**;
- Minimum 10 years mining industry experience (brownfield and greenfield environments) with ideally 3 to 5 years in a similar senior role;
- Specific experience working in (sedimentary hosted, orogenic gold, LS/HS systems) and porphyry systems preferred;
- Extensive experience managing all aspects of drilling programs, including camp infrastructure. Experience working through all four Canadian seasons is a requirement of the role;
- Experience with drill hole planning and mineral resource estimation will be considered an asset;
- Proven leadership capability, with project management experience, ability to evaluate work situations and develop solutions before problems arise;
- A demonstrated commitment to safety, health, environment and community matters;
- In collaboration with the Director of Exploration must be confident providing mentorship and coaching in areas of technical matters to ensure and encourage professional development of junior staff;
- Must have a work history showing self-motivation, confidence, and the ability to work independently and/ or within a group;
- Proven track record of talent development with strong communication, organizational, and interpersonal skills both in the field with staff and contractors, as well as in the boardroom;
- Proficient with ArcPRO, Leapfrog Geo/ (or another GIS and 3D modeling software such as GEMS), MX Deposit (or another data management platform such as acquire), and SQL databases, as well as able to use all Microsoft products (Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint, Project);
- Excellent English oral and written communication skills; knowledge of French will be an asset;
- Ability to work well under pressure in order to meet deadlines.
